Guidelines for use of Lower Barn Clay Studio during COVID

- 1. The studio would only be used by one person at a time. (no children)
- 2. Any person using the studio must keep the door and window open for ventilation.
- 3. Persons must sign up in advance for studio time for three-hour shifts (one in the morning and a second in the afternoon). Micki Segel will create a studio schedule and monitor use of the studio shifts.
- 4. Any person using the studio must wash their hands vigorously upon entering the studio and disinfect the space. The same shall apply prior to leaving the space. Micki will supply the studio with a spray bottle of disinfectant and post a list of all surfaces that need to be cleaned and disinfected.
- 5. Persons using the studio must provide their own ceramic tools, clay, and large sponges for cleaning. All tools with the exceptions of the wheels and bats will be stored and will be off limits for common use. Each person will have to provide their own clay bucket marked with their name for storing unused clay or clay to be reused.
- 6. Greenware may be saved on the shelves identified with the name of the creator, but we have no plans to fire this summer. We will only consider having a firing at the end of the summer if we have enough work to make it worthwhile and the support of cooperators to load the kiln safely under the tutelage of Susan Vladeck.

For the time being the upper clay studio will be off limits due to the numerous supplies that are stored there.
